VI. Initial Thoughts on 2017-18 School Budget – Carolyn Trabuco

- a. School budget presented to BOE equals \$168.8 mm
 - i. Represents +\$5.1 mm and a 3.12% increase over the current year budget.
- b. FLHS impacts
 - i. Among others, the budget adds a ½ time secretary in the main office, increases in the number of electives to be offered, +1.9 FTE (+1.0 Special Ed & +0.9 Electives teachers)
- c. Concerns
 - i. Drop in revenue from the state a major concern
 - ii. Racial Imbalance plan remains an ongoing challenge for Fairfield
